Korean War Veterans Receive “Ambassador for Peace” Medals

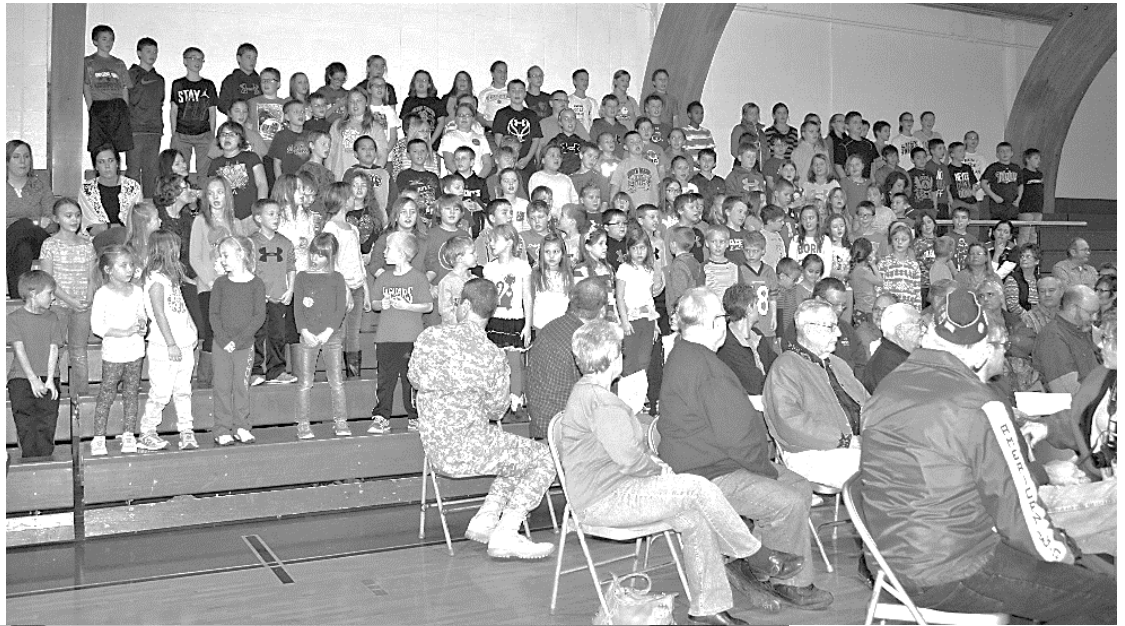
The South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs (SDDVA), in collaboration with the Republic of Korea, hosted the ceremony on January 12, 2016 in the Capitol Rotunda.

The “Ambassador for Peace” medal is bestowed in an expression of appreciation from the people of the Republic of Korea for those who served in Korea's land, air and sea from June 25, 1950 through October 25, 1954.

The American Legion Post 26 of Stickney hosted a local ceremony to honor area Korean veterans in the C/S Elementary gym. A television hook-up was used to watch the program happening live in Pierre at the Capital. After listening to the governor's remarks, local Legion members took over and presented medals in person to our area veterans; Bernard Heruth, Donald Hoffman, Richard Punt and Leonard DeVries. Adames Punt was is Pierre to receive his honor. The elementary classes sang a fitting “Thank You” song for the crowd and the Legion Auxiliary served refreshments to family and friends after the program.

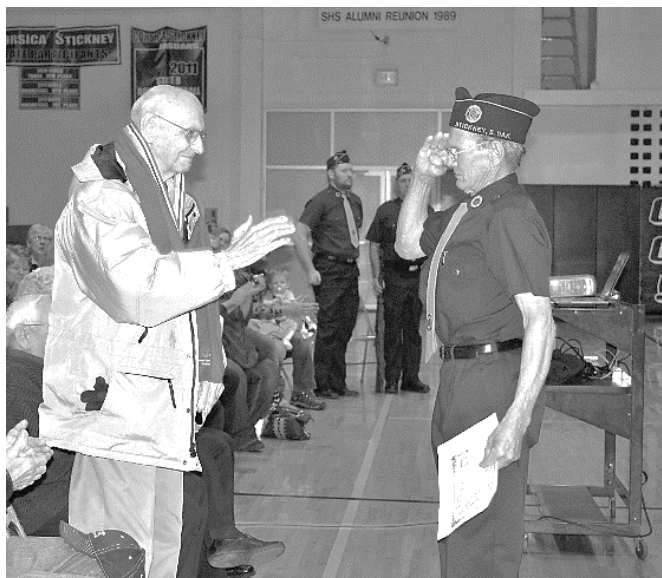

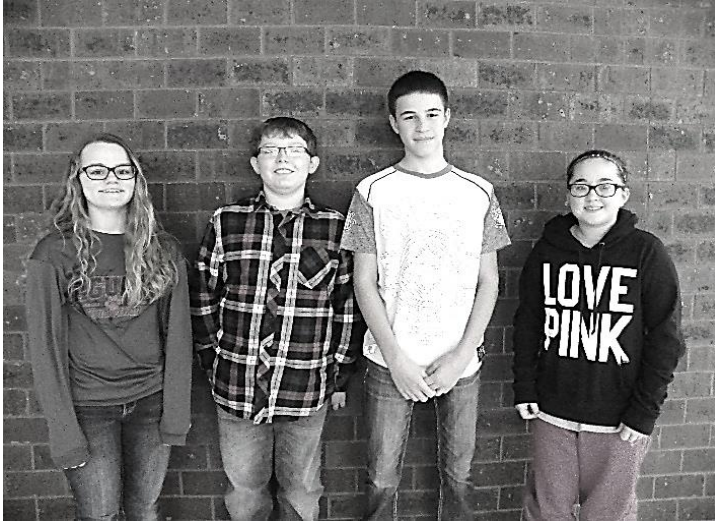

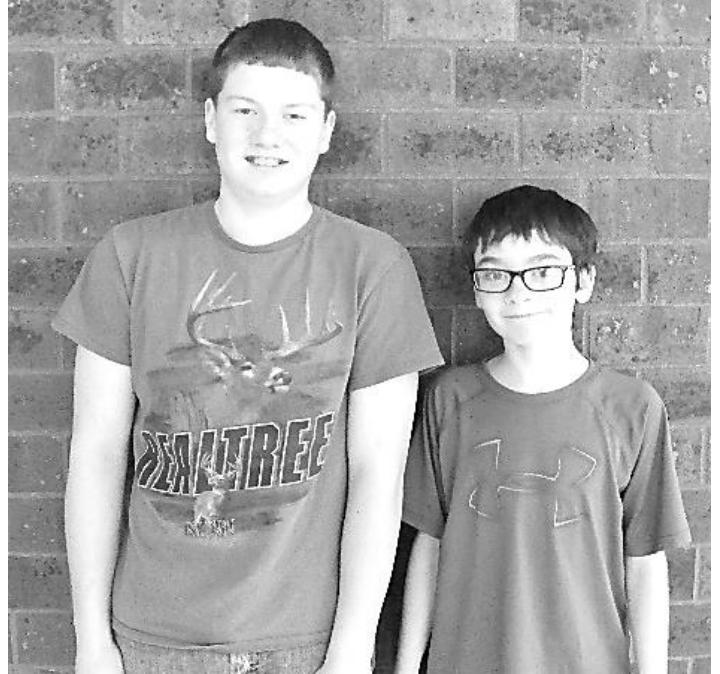

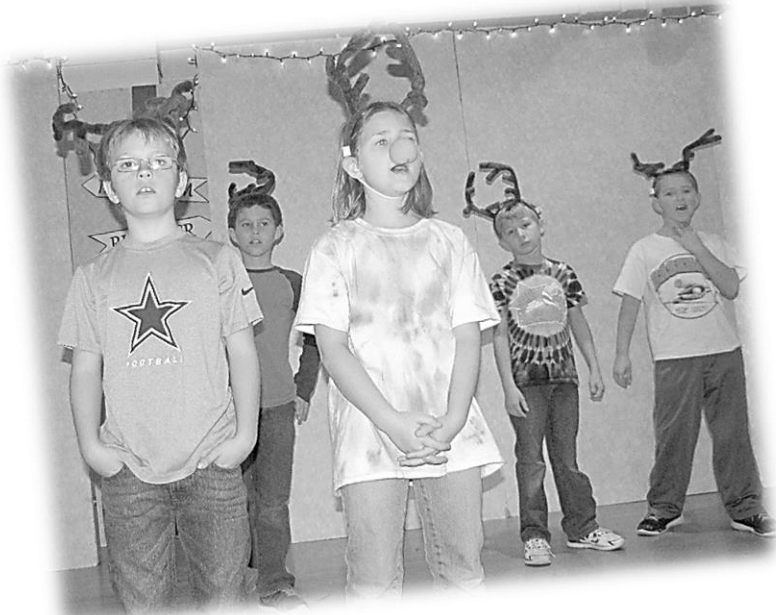

Elementary Christmas Concert Practice



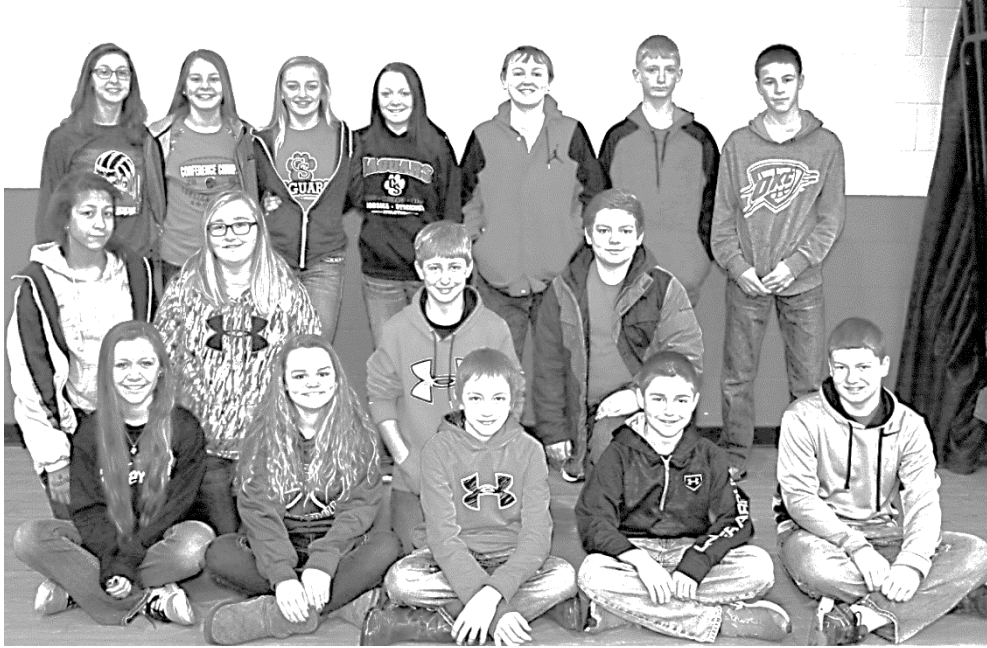
