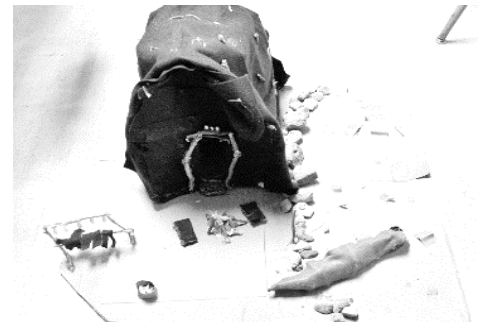
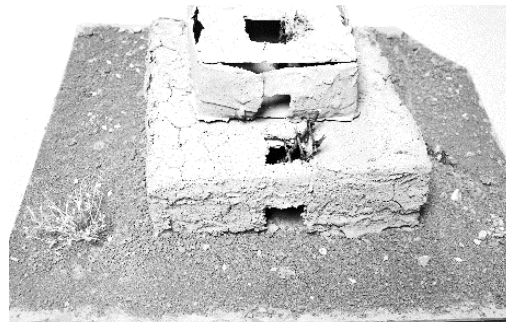

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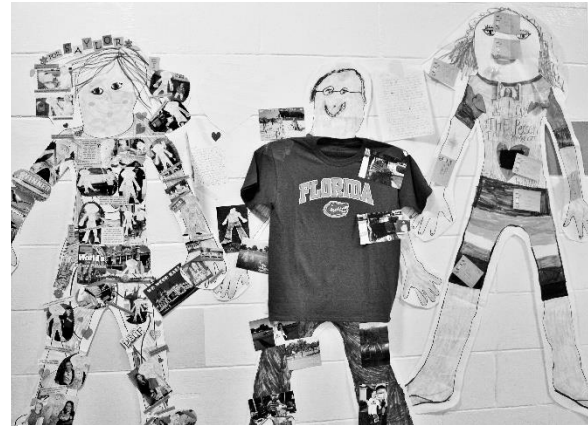


Mr. Wixon's 6<sup>th</sup> graders studied Native American Cultures and created examples of different houses that the natives lived in.

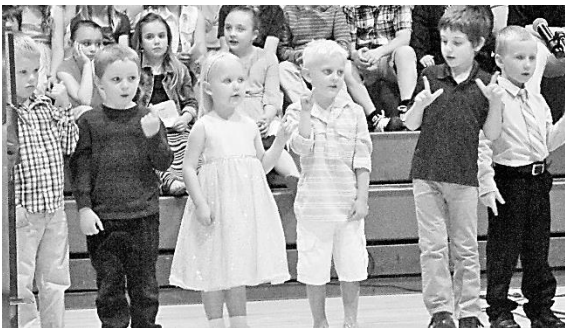
**DRUG ABUSE RESISTANCE EDUCATION**

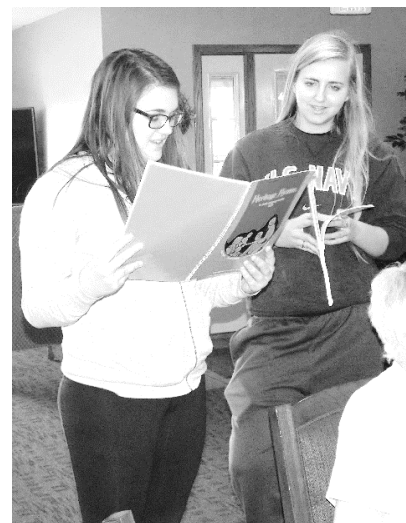

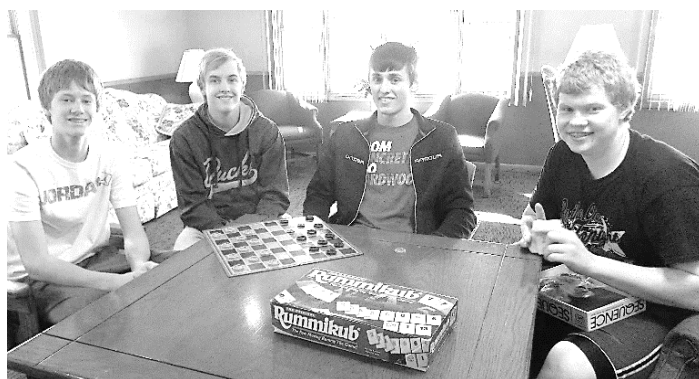




## ~High School Activities~

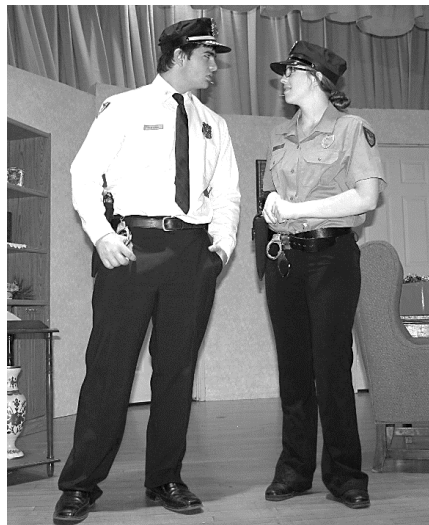
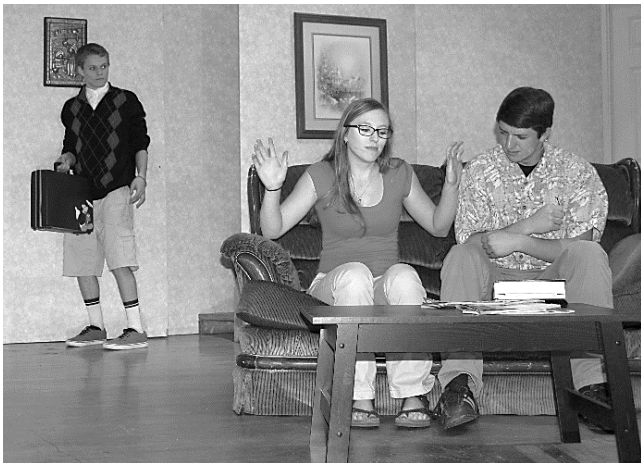
