




The Stickney Volunteer Fire Department visited the Elementary school again this year giving talks, letting students try on the firefighting equipment and checking out the fire trucks.

We placed second overall at the CBH Oral Interpretation contest that was held on October 11 at DWU.







Whatever Floats Your Boat



5th Graders Make Boats What things do you need to consider when making something float? Those were the questions that the fifth grade students needed to answer as they created a raft made from clay. Coming up with an idea of what it should look like, but actually making it float with pennies inside was a whole different matter. The students made changes to their rafts as they discussed and observed what was wrong. As they worked, they discovered ways that the raft could be improved so that it would float. Creating solutions to a problem help the students develop good problem solving skills.
