At this time starting the 20-21 school year will be as normal as we can make it and that depends on infections--We know our school year may change day to day with the Covid-19 Potential. We plan to follow guidance from the SD Dept. of Education in conjunction with Dept. of Health and the CDC. Schools have a unique environment and we have limited tools to combat the Covid problem. Please help us by checking your student for symptoms before sending them to school. If any of the Covid Symptoms are present keep them home and consult your physician. In order for us to keep the school year as normal as possible we must avoid as best we can the infection in the school environment.

We encourage everyone to check it frequently to keep up-to-date on all the activities and on any changes that occur along the way. The website will be kept as current as possible as we keep refining it and adding new items.

<u>Supplies list</u>: A copy of this year's school supply list is available on the school website's home page.

Notice: the school buildings at both campuses will be open at **7:45 AM** for students. **Please DO NOT drop off students before this time as we do not have staff available to supervise.** On days we have a 10am start, breakfast will not be served and the shuttle buses will leave from their respective towns at 9:30am.

First Day of School is Tuesday, August 18th. Full Day--8:35 AM to 3:35 PM.

Breakfast will be served from 7:45 to 8:20 AM. Corsica/Stickney bus students will eat breakfast before leaving to school site. The morning student transport bus to will leave at **8:10 AM Sharp** from each town. Note any student wanting breakfast---Serving will end at 8:20 AM. The PM shuttle will leave Corsica at **3:10pm** and go to Stickney, arriving approximately **3:25pm.** The shuttle will return with students arriving in Corsica approximately **3:40pm**.

New meal prices for the 2020-2021 school year:

Breakfast Prices: K-12--\$1.80 (20 meals=\$36.00), Adult--\$2.20 (20 meals=\$44.00) Lunch Prices: K-6--\$2.85 (20 meals=\$57.00), 7-12--\$3.25 (20 meals=\$65.00), Adult--\$3.85 (20 meals=\$77.00)

If you have children at both schools, you are welcome to write one check and we will apply it at both campuses. We just ask that you **include a note** stating how many lunches/breakfasts you are purchasing **and** for which child. **Please keep tickets purchased monthly!** Breakfast and lunch tickets are for 20 days - if your child(ren) eats daily please remember to send money for tickets at the beginning of **EACH** month (prior to them running out of tickets). **Free and Reduced applications** are in each school packet. You are encouraged to check if you fall within the eligibility guidelines and if so, please submit an application.

Welcome to the 20-21 School Year

Parents/Students we like to welcome everyone back with a 1st day of school planned for Tuesday, August 18, 2020. We are living in a different era of education and virus infections. We also have found planning for what use to be normal activities takes on a new process and is very difficult to have consistency because the situation changes continually. Our objective is to balance health and well-being with the best education process for students/parents/staff.

This year we are asking parents to check with your student in regard to symptoms of covid-19 before sending your student to school. In your school packet you will receive a symptom check list. This is for you to use at home you do not need to return it. We also request if a student demonstrates any of the corona-virus symptoms or is ill please consult with your physician/clinic for current advice. Please don't send them to school being ill. We will attempt to keep the school environment free of the virus so we can have normal classroom attendance as much as possible.

There is an updated student check list for symptoms from SD Dept. of Health to use as a guide. It is also recommended that parents do these checks at home rather than at school.

At this time, we have only 3 basic defenses against the virus. One is to attempt to social distance as best we can and in school we will attempt to do this, but at times this is not possible to get the suggested 6 ft. distance. We encourage masks when it is situationally appropriate. One of the most appropriate times is the shuttle bus between Corsica and Stickney and we will need you to wear a mask on the shuttle bus or if you choose for your student to not ride this bus that is also appropriate. If you have to cough or sneeze you should cover your mouth or nose with your elbow/tissue. The other defense is to wash hands frequently or use hand sanitizer. There will be hand sanitizer located at the entrance of buildings and in each classroom. Upon entering buildings, it would be good to wash or sanitize hands. We not only have to protect our students, but must protect our staff as well.

The DOH/CDC/DOE all have said we must be flexible because what we have to do for educational setting is dependent upon the number of virus cases. We may have in person as per normal educational routine operations all the way to returning to complete e-learning. The school district now has the capability of supplying each student grades 1-12 with a laptop computer. The number of virus cases will impact how we deliver education to students—We hope to be in our classrooms, but there is no way to rule out moving along a continuum of how education is delivered due to the volume of virus cases.

We ask all to be patient and cooperative as we go about the business of educating students while maintaining a healthy environment for all. Again, we hope to give students as much of a full educational experience as safely as possible for all.
