Enclosed (C) are the Regular School Board meeting dates/times/rooms for 2026-27. The reimbursement has been \$60(Chair),\$50(Regular/Special Meetings), \$30(Committee Meetings) and mileage
- 16) Designate the official depository, custodian of accounts, official newspaper and school attorney:**
BMO Harris of Corsica (First Citizens Bank (specifically First-Citizens Bank & Trust Company), American Bank and Trust – Stickney, and SD FIT as official depositories; Angela Feenstra and Scott Muckey as custodians of school accounts; Stickney Argus as official newspaper (Also publish in the Corsica Globe)and Rodney Freeman of Churchill, Manolis, Freeman, Kludt, & Burns LLP as the school attorney and KSB School Law-school attorney.

17) Authorize a school administrator to institute the School Lunch Agreement—

It has been the Superintendent in the past.

18) Set school lunch prices for 2026-27—2025-26 PK-12 Breakfast: \$2.10; Adult Breakfast: \$2.60; K-5 Lunch: \$3.15; 6-12 Lunch: \$3.55, Adult Lunch Price \$5.15 or what the state designates. Average target price is \$3.51 for lunch. Maximum state increase is \$.10. School District can go higher if decided upon.

2026-27 PK-12 Breakfast: \$2.20; Adult Breakfast: \$2.70; K-5 Lunch: \$3.25; 6-12 Lunch: \$3.65, Adult Lunch Price \$5.25 or what the state designates. Average target price is \$3.62 for lunch. Maximum state increase is \$.10. School District can go higher if decided upon.

Breakfast Prices: K-12--\$2.10(20 meals=\$42.00 to \$44.00), Adult--\$2.60(20 meals=\$52.00 to \$54.00)
Lunch Prices: K-5--\$3.15(20 meals=\$63.00), 6-12--\$3.55(20 meals=\$71.00), Adult--\$5.15(20 meals=\$103.00)

Recommendation is to increase all meals the minimum \$.10 or adhere to the state mandate for adult prices.

20) Authorize in a resolution for our business manager to invest/reinvest in a financial institution which serves greatest advantage to the school district.

21) Appoint school truancy officer—Designate-Supt & Principals as such

22) Authorize School Officer for School closing and openings— Superintendent has been designated in the past and he will use the line-of-authority should it be necessary for emergency situations/weather conditions to close school or not to open school. We will use e-learning as we can for weather situations.

23) Establish rental fees for use of school facilities. A copy of our current rental fees for use of school facilities is enclosed.(D)—Recommended to stay as is.

24) Set prices for admission and season passes

We currently charged \$4.00 for students(1-12) and \$6.00 for Adults(Post High School). We offer a “season pass” for all regular home activities for \$10.00 per student and \$30.00 per adult. Family pass \$60.00 and Senior pass 65 and older—Free. Recommendation to leave prices as they are.

25) Student Insurance

We provide online access for Delta Dental and Student Assurance Services, but have no school district obligation with either. The SDHSAA will again provide for the “catastrophic” insurance for students that are involved in the high school activities sponsored by the SDHSAA.

26) Approve the Following for Policy: Corsica-Stickney District Board Policies and Procedures Manual, ASBSD School Board Handbook, School District Negotiated Agreements Manual, the CORE Cooperative Special Education Manual, and The South Dakota School Safety Guide service as our guidelines.

27) Statement of Non-Discrimination.

This non-discrimination statement assures that Corsica-Stickney School District will adhere to Civil Rights procedures regarding employment practices and education programs.

28) School District Assurance Statements

These statements (F) are general assurances that are specific to our school and assures we will provide for students accordingly.

29) Establish mileage, room and meal rates for 2026-27

In the past we have paid “state” rate for mileage, paid single rate for a room at actual cost and have not allowed meal reimbursement unless the activity is “state sponsored”—State Mileage Rate(Currently \$.67.) We currently allow \$35.00 per day (\$5.00 for breakfast, \$10.00 for lunch, \$20.00 for dinner). State meal rates will be \$6 breakfast, \$14.00 lunch, and \$20 for dinner.

30) Gas/Diesel/Heating Fuel Quotes

Authorize the Business manager to get bids/quotes for Gas/Diesel/Heating Fuel.
Stickney Repair has furnished Fuel for Vehicles in Stickney at a discount and Corsica Travel Plaza has furnished fuel for vehicles in Corsica at a discount. Businesses wishing to be notified to bid heating fuel are Farmer Alliance, Brooks Oil Company, Agtegra, Inc.

31) Approve Corsica-Stickney School Community Improvement Plan.(H).

32) Approve Student Handbook, Computer Handbook & EL Handbook for 26-27.

These handbooks are online at the school website.

33) Authorize use of Signature Stamps for Superintendent, Business Manager, and Board Chairman, Authorize Electronic Funds Transfers between school bank accounts.

34) Appoint Title I Consolidated Application Administrator & Section 504 Coordinator 26-27. It has been the Superintendent in years past.

35) Approve Course guidelines for the South Dakota academic content standards in language arts, mathematics, science and social studies should be adopted and implemented as well as any other course guides provided by the state for 2026-27. Authorized by SDCL 13-3-48

36) Appoint Title IX Coordinator, Title IX Investigator, & Appellate Decision Maker.

Brittney Eide should be appointed as Title I Coordinator, Ferra Kemp-Title IX Investigator, Scott Muckey-Appellate Decision Maker.

37) Substitute Teacher Pay---Recommend to change from \$110 per day to \$120 per day for a non-certified Substitute and change from \$130 per day to \$140 per day for Certified Substitute.

Corsica Site Elem Gym Rental Rates: \$20.00 for Athletic Activities or \$1.00 per person up to twenty.
\$60.00 for other activities (includes use of the kitchen).

High School (Corsica)/Grade School(Stickney) Gym Rental Rates/:

\$100.00 for Athletic Activities

Camps/programs that charge a fee/profit from the use of the school facility - \$25 rental per two hour session, \$50.00 for four hours or \$100.00 for time beyond 4 hours.

\$100.00 plus a "Custodial Fee" for other events

Classrooms Rentals: \$50.00 per session for the Computer Room

\$20.00 per session for other Classrooms

It is required that an Instructor/Designated School Personnel be present

NOTE:

Firearms or live ammunition in the school or in school events is prohibited.
