The old Band room has been divided into fal classrooms. The north half is now a vocal fall room and the south half is the Kindergarten rom and hallway.


* he Fourth Grade room of past years has been coverted into the Library which in turn ellows mye seating capacity in the Study Hall and chitional lockers.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Erwin Matzner, Chairman Bernard Hargreaves, Vice Chairman Gordon Van Gorp Joe Dykstra John J. Olivier BAND ROOM: The rehearsal room contains a 65 piece concert band and enough space for the necessary equipment and storage for uniforms. The estimated value of the instruments in this room is 539,000.00 (replacement cost). An office and two practice rooms are used each day for individual and group lessons and practice. An average of 110 students use this facility throughout the school day.

COMMERCIAL ROOM: The spacious Commercial Room has added 17 electric typewriters and new L-shaped desks.

FOURTH GRADE ROOM: Hindows are the greatest improvement for the Fourth Grade, providing sunlight and fresh air. Modern tilt-top desks with plenty of leg space and "move-around-ability" are welcomed. Large bulletin boards give the students space to expand their artistic ability as well as a place to display daily work. The students now have a handy coat rack within the room.

ELEM. PRINCIPAL'S OFFICE, FURNACE ROOM, AND SMALL CLASSROOM: The furnace room houses the heating units and also gives some space for storage of custodial supplies.

The Elementary Principal's office provides necessary work area, record storage and privacy for conferences for that administrator. It is also used for private tutoring.

The small classroom built mainly with shop classes in mind is also used for small Math classes.

SHOP: The new shop along with many other advantages has given us about three times as much room as the old facilities. We have added some new equipment such as a parts cleaner, hydraulic jack, jack stands, and wolder. Most of this equipment has been nurchased through Title III. 53 out of 57 Senior High boys take a Shop class.
