

Gridders lose to Armour

Corsica started out with a tough defense, recovering two fumbles and holding the No. 1 ranked Armour Packers to just six points in the first period. However, the second quarter turned out to be bad news as Armour rolled up 22 points with

the Comet defense weakening.
The next half the Comet defense again toughened up to hold Armour to just 16 points. Even though the Comets had some scoring opportunities they never could get it in the end zone.

Brad Vanden Hoek led Corsica with 131 yards on 23 totes. Tim Fey followed with 64 yards on 11 carries, and Kurt Noteboom had 34 yards on nine carries. Corsica had 227 yards rushing and 269 total yards.

Corsica's leading defender was Travis De Lange with eight tackles and a fumble recovery, Kurt Bye 7, Brad Vanden Hoek 6, Tim Fey and Kurt Noteboom 5, and Troy Bosma had four tackles and a fumble recovery. Rob Ralston also had a fumble

Corsica returned six ckoffs. Kurt Noteboom kickoffs. returned four for an average of 14.3 yard per carry, and Brad Vanden Hoek had two returns with an average of 11 yards per carry.

Corsica had seven first downs; two passing, four rushing, and one penalty. four Corsica had five penalties for 45 yards.

The next game for the Comets is the final game of the 1984 season when Corsica travels to Kimball on October 19.
