

CHERYL BEUKELMAN




My future plans are to do as little as possible.

I don't plan on going to school but will possibly get a job.



CINDY BULTJE


I am trying to find a job for this summer and next fall I am accepted at Calvary Bible College in Kansas City, Missouri. I plan on majoring in elementary education.






BRENDA PETERS

I plan to start school at Stewart's Hairstyling June 7 in Sioux City, Iowa.



I'll miss mostly the good times and all the friends.




MIKE VANDEN HOEK
