Tornado watches manded the attention of local residents over the week end as heavy rains and strong winds pelted the county.

The unseasonably warm temperatures of the past week, including record breaking days in the 90s, ran headlong into a cooling front which entered the state last Friday. Dark clouds set in during the day, and heavy rains began around 6:00 p.m.

By the time the evening was through, the winds had caused extensive farm building damage in eastern and southern Douglas County. Delmont lost electrical power for 1 1/2 hours, and a tree blew were reported as a result of the to the Tyndall hospital. storm.

Parkston reported winds of com- 50-70 miles per hour and also saw extensive farm damage. Stop signs were uprooted in town.
